Balint Society of Australia

A working group in Melbourne is meeting regularly to develop a structure for this newly formed organization. We have commenced working on a website. We have established a national mailing list to which we send Balint Bulletin. We have some contacts with some interstate Balint groups, leaders and people interested in starting or joining groups. We have a clinical group for Balint group leaders and prospective leaders.

Scientific Meeting

Our first scientific meeting was held on March 23 in Melbourne with visiting guest speaker from Sweden, Dr Henry Jablonski, speaking on the topic "What Makes a Balint Group a Balint Group?" Henry's address was based on a paper he presented at the International Balint Federation Congress in 2003 which is attached. Henry also included some fascinating information about Balint work in Sweden. Those attending included GPs, psychiatrists and psychotherapists and there was a lively discussion.

International Balint Federation Congress

RACGP Annual Convention

The Balint workshop will consist of small group discussions about clinical material from participants' practices, facilitated by experienced Australian and overseas Balint group leaders.
